

For decades Friendly House has used a quote on letterhead, brochures, etc. that says "The good you do for yourself dies with you. The good you do for your community lives forever." That quote says everything when referring to former Executive Director Fran Ivory who passed away on July 27, 2018. Fran served Friendly House

FROM THE DIRECTOR from 1985 until May of 1997. Friendly House was already 89 years old but Fran spearheaded the improvement in programs and services and led a successful capital campaign to build a new building in 1993. Fran was extremely active in Rotary and Optimist and worked with a group to raise the funds to bring the first indoor ice arena to the Quad Cities and the first organized hockey. Fran not only made a difference in his time here; he served as a VISTA worker and worked at two other settlement houses in the Minneapolis/St. Paul area. He is survived by his wife, Roie, three children and their spouses, and seven grandchildren. I was honored to work with Fran for 10 years. I am grateful for his leadership and unselfish commitment to leaving this community stronger. The good he did in this world will live forever.
